#### **AABP Releases "Constructing a Value Proposition" Webinar**

First in a four-part webinar series, this information is designed to help bovine practitioners identify and market the value of their practices.

The American Association of Bovine Practitioners (AABP) has released the first in a four-part webinar series for bovine practices designed to help veterinarians understand what the "value proposition" is of their practice and services, and how to market that to clients.

The 16-minute webinar, "Constructing a Value Proposition", was developed by the AABP Veterinary Sustainability Committee. Committee Project Leader David Welch, VMD, MBA, Berlin, Penn., says in June 2013, business consultant Dick Lewis introduced the committee to the topic of the value proposition and how it might be applied to veterinary practice. "Value proposition tables are utilized in sales to help organize services based on the promise of value to be received by the client," Welch explains. "Organizing and viewing a veterinarian's service offerings from the perspective of the client and placing various services in categories of sophistication help us to think more strategically about our services."

Though the value proposition information in the webinar can be used in any type of practice, for demonstration purposes a dairy practice was used as an example. "Many practices would benefit from looking objectively at their various services from the client's viewpoint," Welch says.

Upcoming webinars in the Value Proposition Series will focus on developing a partial budget, marketing the value proposition and measuring the impact of the value proposition on a practice, respectively. The purpose of the entire series is to provide a tool that practices can use to revitalize their service offerings, provide services that clients will value and improve the efficiency and performance of the individual practice. "Webinar 1 is the starting point and lays the foundation for the initial discussion and for subsequent webinars to build upon," Welch says.

AABP's Veterinary Practice Sustainability Committee strongly encourages all practices to use the webinars as a starting point to engage all practice stakeholders (owners, managers, clinicians, associates and support staff). "AABP offers these webinars free of charge to members," Welch adds. "Implementing them may change the value of your practice offerings, and the value of your future."

#### **Prudent Use of Antibiotics**

One, and probably the best way to control the occurrence of multi resistant bacteria in humans (and animals) is a world-wide reduction of the use of antibiotics. "The Swiss Veterinary Association for Health of Ruminants" is increasingly criticized by different groups (doctors in human medicine, meat consumers, label-food distributors etc.) for failing to restrain effectively the light handed administration of antibiotics in veterinary practice.

On the other hand the veterinary profession is obliged to prevent and heal infectious diseases in order to comply with animal protection legislation.

A politically well accepted market idea is the production of veal under restricted use of antibiotics or even without antibiotic altogether. However, for us vets in farm animal practice it is hard to see how farmers could achieve this respectable goal without simultaneously altering a number of other usages like selective breeding, transport methods, transport ways, re-grouping, feeding, stabling etc. and a general prevention by vaccination.

If you start reducing antimicrobial mass therapy in veal production without changing anything else, you will cause considerable suffering in animals that may be affected by pneumonia and/or diarrhoea. Without altered breeding and feeding methods, transportation rules and structures in existing farm houses many calves might not survive. Therefore, only reducing the yearly amount of prescribed antibiotics will cause increased losses in animals, and the legislation on animal protection will become a farce.

Considerate use of antibiotics is a worth, while goal for all of us. But in isolation it cannot solve the existing problems in meat production.
